Political Science majors are strongly advised to take POL 112 or 211 before taking POL 205 or 212. Majors should try to complete POL 112 during their freshman year and POL 205, 211 and 212 by the end of their sophomore year. Majors are strongly encouraged to do a minor or second major in History, Economics, or Psychology. In addition to a minor or second major in one of these disciplines, majors planning to go to graduate school are strongly advised to take at least two semesters of a foreign language, so that they have an "intermediate" understanding or better of the language. They should also take, in addition to Elementary Statistics, MAT 114, Business Calculus (MAT 122), and/or Research Methods in Business and Economics (ECN 235), Research Tools in Psychology (PSY 270), Math Probabilities and Statistics (MAT 313).

Political Science majors must have a C average or better in the set of courses presented to satisfy major requirements.
